



## Neighborhood Greening Tree Planting Application

The Dundalk Renaissance Corporation invites community members in Dundalk and the North Point Peninsula to apply for free trees and organization support to hold a tree planting in their neighborhood. Residents, church members, schools, associations or businesses in the area with property along the route to be planted are invited to complete this application. Funding availability varies with planting location and overall project cost. Community members considering a tree planting in their neighborhood are encouraged to contact the DRC's Volunteer Maryland Coordinator for the Greening of Dundalk to discuss funding options.

Those requesting trees must agree to help on planting day to the best of their ability and to provide aftercare for the trees (watering, mulching, and weeding) for at least two years after the planting. Group leaders filling out the application agree to be a liaison between the planting group and the Dundalk Renaissance Corporation. The Dundalk Renaissance Corporation agrees to provide organizational, and technical support, as well as some tools, for planting projects.
